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# Control of traffic and parking Bye-Laws 2016

Cavan County Council in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 36 of the Road Traffic Act, 1994, as amended and every other power it enabling and after consultation with the Commissioner of An Garda Síochána, hereby makes the following Bye-Laws in respect of the area comprising the administrative County of Cavan.

## Part I

### *Preliminary*

#### 1. Short title

These Bye-Laws may be cited as the County of Cavan Traffic and Parking Bye-Laws, 2016.

#### 2. Commencement of Bye-Laws

These Bye-Laws shall come into operation on the 1<sup>ST</sup>, day of NOVEMBER, 2016.

#### 4. Interpretation

(1) In these Bye-Laws—

"the Act of 1961" means the Road Traffic Act, 1961 (No. 24 of 1961);

"the Act of 1968" means the Road Traffic Act, 1968 (No. 25 of 1968);

"the Act of 1993" means the Road Traffic Act, 1993 (No. 14 of 1993);

"the Act of 1994" means the Road Traffic Act, 1994; (No.7 of 1994);

"the Act of 2002" means the Road Traffic Act, 2002, (No. 12 of 2002)

**“appointed stand”** means the appointed places in public roads in the area at which street service vehicles may stand for hire.

**“buffer area”** means an area between two parking bays;

**“business hours”** means the hours of operation indicated on the appropriate pay and display parking ticket machine, or the appropriate information plate, Monday to Saturday inclusive (exclusive of Holidays);

**"casual trading"** and **"casual trading area"** have the meanings assigned to them by the Casual Trading Act, 1995 (No. 19 of 1995);

**“the Council”** means Cavan County Council.

**"disabled persons parking bay"** means a space intended for the parking of a mechanically propelled vehicle in which is displayed a disabled persons parking permit;

**“disabled persons parking permit”** means a permit issued by any of the bodies listed in the Schedule hereto;

**"footpath"** means a road over which there is a public right of way for pedestrians only, not being a footway;

**"footway"** means that portion of any road associated with a roadway which is provided primarily for use by pedestrians;

**"goods vehicle"** means a vehicle used exclusively for carrying goods and taxed for commercial purposes;

**"grass margin"** means that portion of a public road situated on either side of the footway and which is provided for the growing of grass, trees or shrubbery of any kind;

**"holiday"** means the days specified in Article 21 or any other day that is a public holiday for the purposes of the Holidays (Employees) Act, 1973 (No. 25 of 1973);

**"information plate"**, for the purpose of these Bye-Laws, means a plate of the type authorised by and described in paragraph 4 of Part VI of the First Schedule to the Regulations of 1962;

**"loading bay"** has the meaning assigned to it in Article 11 ;

**"local authority"** means the Council of the County of Cavan

**"median strip"** means a boundary between the two carriageways of a road other than a traffic sign to which Article 10 of the Regulations of 1997 refers;

**"owner"** means a resident by whom a vehicle is habitually kept and used;

**“pay and display parking ticket”** means a parking ticket which is issued by the Council by means of a pay and display parking ticket machine and which contains the following particulars;

1. The words “Cavan” and/or “Comhairle Chontae an Chabhain”,



2. The fee paid in respect of the ticket,
3. The date and time of issue of the ticket,
4. The time of expiry of the ticket;

**"pay and display parking ticket machine"** means a machine capable of automatically delivering a pay and display parking ticket when the parking fee prescribed by these Bye-Laws is paid;

**"parking bay"** means the area contained between lines of the type referred to in Article 18 of the Regulations of 1997;

**"parking zone"** means the street or car park indicated on the appropriate pay and display parking ticket machine, or the appropriate information plate;

**"pedestrian crossing"** means a portion of the roadway specially marked for use by pedestrians crossing the road and is indicated by means of roadway markings of the type authorised by and described in Article 38 of the Regulations of 1997;

**"pedestrian crossing complex"** has the meaning assigned to it by Article 2 of the Road Traffic (Signs) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations, 1979 ( S.I. No. 329 of 1979 ) and is indicated by roadway markings of the type referred to in Article 3 of the aforementioned Regulations;

**"public road"** means a road over which a public right of way exists and the responsibility for the maintenance of which lies on a road authority;

**"resident"** means a person whose normal residence is at premises situated in a street containing a disc parking place;

**"resident's parking permit"** means a document issued by a local authority for the purposes of Articles 14 to 20 and containing the particulars specified in Article 15;

**"restricted parking place"** means a place where parking is prohibited by Article 8 (2);

**"road"** has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 (1) of the Act of 1993;

**"road junction"** means the section of roadway contained within the projection of roadway boundaries at the intersection of roadways;

**"roadway"** has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 (1) of the Act of 1993;

**"the Regulations of 1962"** means the Road Traffic (Signs) Regulations, (S.I. No. 171 of 1962);

**"the Regulations of 1966"** means the Road Traffic (Signs) (Amendment) Regulations 1966. (S.I. No. 233 of 1966);

**"the Regulations of 1969"** means the Road Traffic (Signs) (Amendment) Regulations, 1969 (S.I. No. 217 of 1969);

**"the Regulations of 1974"** means the Road Traffic (Signs) (Amendment) Regulations, 1974 (S.I. No. 247 of 1974);

**"the Regulations of 1997"** means the Road Traffic (Signs) Regulations, 1997 (S.I. No. 181 of 1997);

**"the Regulations of 2006"** means The Road Traffic Acts 1961-2005 (Fixed Charge Offences) Regulations, (S.I. No. 135 of 2006);

**"street"** means a public road;

**"street service vehicle"** has the meaning assigned to it by Section 3 of the Road Traffic Act, 1961 (No. 24 of 1961);

**"traffic sign"** has the meaning assigned to it by section 95(1) of the Act of 1961, as amended by section 37 of the Act of 1994;

**"traffic warden"** has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 (3) of the Local Authorities (Traffic Wardens) Act, 1975 (No. 14 of 1975);

**"valid resident's parking permit"** means a resident's parking disc which relates to a particular street or streets and to a period which has not expired and which is issued by the local authority in whose functional area the vehicle on which the disc is displayed is parked;

**"vehicle"** means a private motor car, a station wagon or a passenger vehicle having accommodation for not more than seven passengers excluding the driver;

- (2) A reference in these Bye-Laws to the loading of goods shall be taken to include the supplying of fuel for the operation of the vehicle.
- (3) A reference in these Bye-Laws to any matter (including a reference to a particular traffic sign, roadway marking or information plate) prescribed in the Road Traffic (Signs) Regulations, 1997, shall be taken to include a reference to such matter as prescribed in Bye-Laws which are for the time being in force under section 95 (2) of the Act of 1961 and which amend or replace the aforementioned Road Traffic (Signs) Regulations, 1997.

## **5. Area of application**

- (1) These Bye-Laws apply to the area comprising the administrative County of Cavan.

## **6. Non-application of certain Prohibitions and Restrictions**

- (1) These Bye-Laws shall apply save where compliance is not possible as a result of an obstruction to traffic or pedestrians or because of an emergency situation confronting a road user which could not reasonably have been expected or anticipated.
- (2) Save where otherwise expressly provided in these Bye-Laws, a prohibition on the entry of a vehicle to a road or an area or the prohibition on the stopping or parking of a vehicle imposed by these Bye-Laws shall not apply to;

- (a) a vehicle used in connection with the removal of an obstruction to traffic;
  - (b) a vehicle being used by a clamping operator or under the direction of clamping operator, in the course of clamping activities as provided for in the Vehicle Clamping Act 2015
  - (c) a vehicle being used in connection with the carrying out of roadwork's;
  - (d) a fire brigade, an ambulance, or a vehicle being used by a member of the Garda Síochána in performance of the duties of that member;
  - (e) a vehicle which has been damaged or has broken down, during the period necessary to effect repairs to the vehicle or remove it from the location;
  - (f) a prohibition on the parking of a vehicle imposed by Article 8 (2)(a) shall not apply to a vehicle parked while goods are being loaded in or on to it or unloaded from it, for a period not exceeding thirty minutes from the commencement of the parking.
- (3) A restriction on the parking of a vehicle imposed by Article 8 (2) shall not apply to;
- (a) a vehicle to which paragraphs (a),(b),(c), (d),(e) of Article 6 (2) above, applies;
  - (b) a vehicle parked at the edge of a roadway while a passenger is entering or leaving it; or
  - (c) a vehicle parked while goods are being loaded in or on to it or unloaded from it, for a period not exceeding thirty minutes from the commencement of the parking.

## **7. Directions of Garda Síochána**

- (1) A driver of a vehicle or a pedestrian shall comply with a direction given by a member of the Garda Síochána for the purpose of regulating or controlling traffic.
- (2) Where a direction given by a member of the Garda Síochána is inconsistent with a provision in these Bye-Laws, the direction shall override that provision.

## **PART II**

### *Rules for Parking*

## **8. Prohibitions on Parking**

- (1) Save as otherwise provided for in these Bye-Laws and subject to Article 5, a vehicle shall not be parked on a public road at a location, in a manner or for a purpose referred to in this Article.
- (2) A vehicle shall not be parked;
  - (a) on that side of a section of roadway along the edge of which traffic sign number RRM 008 [double yellow lines] has been provided;



- (b) on a section of roadway where traffic sign number RUS 019 [No Parking sign] has been provided, during the period indicated on the information plate accompanying such traffic sign;
- (c) within 5 metres of a road junction;
- (d) on a section of roadway with less than 3 traffic lanes and where traffic sign number RRM 001 [continuous white line] has been provided;
- (e) on a section of roadway where traffic sign number RUS 020, in association with RRM 029 [appointed stand], has been placed to indicate that an appointed stand has been provided;
- (f) in any place, position or manner that will result in the vehicle obstructing, delaying or interfering with the entrance to or exit from a fire brigade station, an ambulance station or a Garda station;
- (g) in any place, position or manner that will result in the vehicle obstructing an entrance or an exit for vehicles to or from a premises, save with the consent of the occupier of such premises;
- (h) within 15 metres (on the approach side) or 5 metres (on the side other than the approach side) of a section of roadway where any of the following traffic signs have been provided;
  - (i) traffic sign number RPC 001 [Pedestrian Crossing];
  - (ii) traffic sign number RPC 002 [Pedestrian Crossing Complex]; or
  - (iii) traffic sign numbers RTS 001, RTS 002, RTS 003 or RTS 004 [traffic lights];
- (i) on a footpath, a grass margin or a median strip;
- (j) on a part of a roadway which is a casual trading area, during hours of trading, unless the vehicle is for the time being in use for the purposes of casual trading;
- (k) in a manner in which it will interfere with the normal flow of traffic or which obstructs or endangers other traffic;
- (l) where traffic sign RUS 031 [bus stop] or RRM 030 [stopping place or stand] has been provided unless the vehicle is an omnibus.
- (m) in a manner which obstructs any designated cycle track.

## 9. Restrictions on Parking

- (1) A vehicle shall not be parked during a period which may be indicated on an information plate, on that side of a section of roadway along the edge of which traffic sign number RRM 007 [single yellow line] has been provided.



- (2)
  - (a) Subject to paragraph (b), where traffic sign number RUS 018 [Restricted Parking] is provided a vehicle may only be parked for the length of time and, where appropriate, during the period, indicated on the information plate accompanying the sign.
  - (b) Subject to Article 12 (3), where a vehicle is removed from a street in respect of which paragraph (a) applies it may not be parked again in that street within one hour of its removal during the period when the restriction is in force.
- (3)
  - (a) Subject to paragraphs (b) and (c), a vehicle, other than a large public service vehicle, shall not be parked where traffic sign number RUS 019 [No Parking] accompanied by an information plate containing the words "Except Buses - Ach Amháin Busanna" is provided.
  - (b)
    - (i) The restriction referred to in paragraph (a) may be applied for a specific period which shall be indicated on an information plate.
    - (ii) A large public service vehicle parked in accordance with paragraph (a) shall not be parked for a period exceeding one hour from the commencement of such parking.
  - (c) Where a large public service vehicle, having been parked in that portion of a roadway where the restriction as provided for in paragraph (b) applies, leaves, it shall not be parked again in that portion of the roadway within one hour of leaving while the restriction applies.
- (4) Where a vehicle is parked in a parking place which is the subject of a provision contained in Regulations made under section 36 of the Road Traffic Act of 1994 it shall only be parked in accordance with such a provision.
- (5) Where traffic sign number RRM 011, RRM 012, RRM 013 or RRM 014 [Parking Bays] is provided, a vehicle must be parked within the limits of the parking bay.

**10. Prohibition on Parking at School Entrances.**

- (1) A vehicle may not be stopped or parked on a section of a roadway where traffic sign number RRM 010 [Stopping prohibition at school entrances] is provided.
- (2) Article 10 (1) above, shall apply notwithstanding any indication to the contrary given by means of another traffic sign.

**11. Parking in Loading Bays**

- (1) Where traffic sign number RRM 009 [Loading Bay] is provided, a vehicle other than a goods vehicle being used for loading or unloading shall not be parked during a period which shall be indicated on an information plate.
- (2) A goods vehicle being used for loading or unloading shall not be parked in a loading bay for a period exceeding 30 minutes.

**12. Disabled Persons Permits**

- (1) For the purposes of these Bye-Laws, a disabled person means a person who is suffering from a disability that prevents that person from walking or causes undue hardship to the person.
- (2)
  - (a) A disabled person's parking permit may be granted by a local authority or by any of the bodies listed in the Schedule.
  - (b) A permit granted under section 90 of the Road Traffic Act of 1961 shall be deemed to be a permit granted under these Bye-Laws.
- (3) Article 9 (2) (b) shall not apply to a vehicle in which a valid disabled person's parking permit is displayed and which is parked for the convenience of the person to whom that permit was granted.
- (4) A permit granted in accordance with Article 12 (2) shall be valid for two years from the date of its issue.

**13. Disabled Persons' Parking Bays**

Disabled person's parking bays shall be for;

- (1) Subject to 13 (2) below, where traffic sign number RRM 015 [Disabled Persons Parking Bay] is provided, a vehicle shall not be stopped or parked.
- (2) Sub-article (1) above shall not apply to a vehicle in which is displayed a valid disabled person's parking permit and which is parked for the convenience of the person to whom the permit was granted.

## **Part III**

### *Pay and Display Ticket Parking*

#### **14. Parking in Pay and Display Ticket Parking Places**

- (1) Parking places set out in the Articles 14 (1) (a) to (d) below will be controlled by “Pay and Display Parking Ticket” Parking. The following provisions shall apply during business hours to the parking of a vehicle in a “Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place”.
  - (a) Subject to paragraph (2) of this Article, a vehicle which is parked in a Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place during business hours shall, where parking bays are provided at that Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place, be parked within the area comprising a parking bay,
  - (b) A vehicle which had been parked in a Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place for the maximum period permitted in that Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place, as indicated on the appropriate Pay and Display ticket parking machine, shall not be parked again in a Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place on the public road or car park in which that Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place is situated until at least one hour has elapsed since the vehicle was last parked in that Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place,
  - (c) A vehicle shall not be parked in a buffer area,
  - (d) A vehicle parked in a Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place at a time which is not during business hours must display a valid Pay and Display Parking Ticket when a period of business hours commences,
  - (e) Where a vehicle being parked in a Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place during business hours is a goods vehicle parked while goods are being actively loaded in or on to it or unloaded from it Article 16 shall not apply until the expiration of 30 minutes after the commencement of the parking.
- (2) Notwithstanding Article 14 (1)(a) of this Bye-Law, a vehicle parked in a parking bay during business hours may project into an adjoining buffer area if the length of the vehicle prevents its being parked wholly within the area comprising a parking bay.
- (3) When a Pay and Display Parking Ticket machine for a parking bay where a vehicle is parked, malfunctions or is out of order, a valid Pay and Display parking ticket must be obtained from a working Pay and Display parking ticket machine in the same parking zone.



### **15. Vehicles which may be parked in Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place**

- (1) Mechanically propelled vehicles only, of the following classes, may be parked in a parking bay/ Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place during business hours;
  - (a) a passenger vehicle with passenger accommodation for not more than seven persons excluding the driver and not drawing a trailer or other vehicle
  - (b) a goods vehicle whose unladen weight does not exceed 3 tonnes and not drawing a trailer or other vehicle

### **16. Obligation to display a valid Pay and Display parking ticket**

- (1) A valid Pay and Display parking ticket, residential parking permit, or a valid disabled persons parking permit shall be displayed, on the interior of a vehicle lawfully parked in a Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place in a ticket parking area during business hours.
- (2) The valid Pay and Display parking ticket / permit shall be so exhibited in the interior of the vehicle that a person outside the vehicle can ascertain when the parking ticket ceases to be valid and,
- (3) The Pay and Display parking ticket shall be exhibited in accordance with Article 16 (2) of this Bye-Law for so long as the vehicle is parked in that Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place.

### **17. Appropriate parking fees and minimum payment**

- (1) The fees payable as shown on the appropriate parking ticket machine.
- (2) These charges may be varied from time to time as determined by resolution of the Council.
- (3) The method of operations and systems of charges in the car parks and parking places maybe varied from time to time as determined by resolution of the Council.
- (4) The parking fee payable for a Pay and Display Ticket for parking on public roads shall be calculated on an hourly basis at the rate of 60 cent per hour for each continuous period of parking up to a maximum period of 2 hours; or such other maximum period as indicated on the appropriate pay and display ticket parking machine, if any.
- (5) The parking fee payable for a Pay and Display Ticket for parking in car parks shall be calculated on an hourly basis at the rate of 40 cent per hour for each continuous period of parking up to the maximum of 2 hours; or such other maximum period as indicated on the appropriate Pay and Display ticket parking machine, if any.





### **18. Manner and time of payment of parking fee**

- (1) A Pay and Display parking ticket shall be purchased from an appropriate Pay and Display parking ticket machine.
- (2) The fee for the Pay and Display parking ticket shall be payable by means of any combination of valid coins, or, where the facility is provided, by payment card or mobile phone.
- (3) Where applicable, payment of cash shall be made by inserting the appropriate fee for the parking time required into the appropriate parking ticket machine and following the instructions on the parking ticket machine in order to obtain a valid Pay and Display parking ticket.
- (4) Payment by payment card shall be made by inserting the payment card into the parking ticket machine and following the instructions on the parking ticket machine in order to obtain a valid pay & display parking ticket.
- (5) The valid parking ticket shall be displayed promptly on parking provided that, where a vehicle is parked at a time not during business hours, the valid parking ticket shall be displayed in accordance with Article 16 at the commencement of business hours.

### **19. Period of parking in Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place**

A vehicle parked in a Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place during business hours shall not be so parked for a period longer than the period indicated on the appropriate Pay and Display sign, as the maximum period for which parking is permitted on that day in that Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place.

### **20. Prohibition on certain parking inside an hour of leaving Pay and Display Parking Ticket place**

A vehicle which has been parked in a Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place shall not be parked again in a Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place on the same public road or car park in which the Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place is situated until at least one hour after the vehicle last vacated the Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place.

### **21. Suspension of parking controls on specified day**

Paid parking controls shall not apply in any Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place during the days specified below or any other public holiday as defined within the Holidays (Employees) Act 1975. Paid parking controls shall not apply in any paid parking area on the following days;

- (1) New Year's Day (1st January)
- (2) St. Patrick's Day (17th March)
- (3) Good Friday (Variable)

- (4) Easter Sunday (Variable)
- (5) Easter Monday (Variable)
- (6) May Public Holiday (First Monday in May)
- (7) June Public holiday (First Monday in June)
- (8) August Public holiday (First Monday in August)
- (9) October Public Holiday Last Monday in October
- (10) Christmas Day (25th December)
- (11) St. Stephen's Day (26th December)

## **22. Non application of Bye-Laws for disabled person.**

Articles 14, 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20 shall not apply to a vehicle, which is parked in a Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place by a disabled person who holds a valid disabled persons parking permit in respect of the parking of such vehicle provided the permit is prominently displayed and clearly visible in the vehicle so parked.

## **23. Interference**

- (1) A person shall not insert any coin, article or object, other than a payment card or the coins specified for the purchase of a Pay and Display parking ticket, in a Pay and Display parking ticket machine, or interfere in any other way with a Pay and Display parking ticket machine in a Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place.
- (2) No person other than an agent of the Council, a member of the Garda Siochana, an authorised person, or a traffic warden shall interfere in any way with a hood, sign or other device placed on a Pay and Display parking ticket machine in a Pay and Display Ticket Parking Place.
- (3) A person shall not interfere with, alter or deface a Pay and Display parking ticket machine.
- (4) An agent of the Council, authorised officer or traffic warden shall not be interfered with in any way while performing his/her duties under these Bye-Laws;

## **24. Non-compliance with Bye-Laws**

Any person in breach of these Bye-Laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be subject to a fine as prescribed by the Act of 2002 and the Regulations of 2006.

## **Part IV**

### *Parking Permit for Residents*

#### **25. Non-application of Bye-Laws.**

Article 9 (2) of these Bye-Laws shall not apply to the parking of a vehicle in a restricted parking place if there is displayed, in accordance with Part III of these Bye-Laws, in the vehicle when it is so parked, a valid resident's parking permit which relates to the street in which that restricted parking place is situated.

#### **26. Particulars of resident's parking permit.**

(1) A resident's parking permit shall contain the following particulars;

- (a) the name of the local authority by whom it is issued,
- (b) the registration number of the vehicle in respect of which it is issued,
- (c) the date of issue,
- (d) the street or streets to which it relates,
- (e) the period to which it relates, including the date of expiry.

#### **27. Permission to park a vehicle displaying resident's parking permit.**

The display, in accordance with Part III of these Bye-Laws of a valid resident's parking permit on the vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued, shall allow the owner of the vehicle (or any person using it with his consent) to park it without limitation as to time in a restricted parking place in a street to which the permit relates.

#### **28. Display of valid resident's parking permit.**

A valid resident's parking permit shall be so displayed in the interior of the vehicle in respect of which it is issued that it can be read from outside the vehicle.

#### **29. Interference with resident's parking permit.**

Where a vehicle displaying a valid resident's parking permit is parked in a restricted parking place a person shall not interfere with the permit.

#### **30. Issue of, and fee for resident's parking permit.**

(1) A resident's parking permit shall be issued by the Council in respect of the parking of a vehicle in a restricted parking place in the functional area of the Council.



- (2) The fee for a resident's parking permit shall be €20.00
- (3) A resident's parking permit shall be issued by the Council in respect of the vehicle of which the resident is the owner and shall be valid for a period of one year from the date of issue, in respect of that vehicle and for the street or streets to which the permit relates.
- (4) The Council reserves the right to request further information if deemed necessary in order to process an application for a resident's parking permit.

**31. Return and transfer of resident's parking permit.**

- (1) Where, during the period to which a resident's parking permit relates, the resident to whom it is issued ceases to reside at the address specified on the permit or ceases to be an owner by disposing of the vehicle to which the permit relates, the resident shall return it to the Council.
- (2) Where, during the period to which a resident's parking permit relates, the resident to whom it is issued disposes of the vehicle to which the permit relates and substitutes another vehicle for the one disposed of, he shall return the permit to the local authority by whom the permit was issued which, upon payment of a fee of €10.00 by the resident, shall issue to the resident a new permit in respect of that vehicle, and such new permit shall be valid for the period specified.

## **Part V**

### *Permission for non-operation of parking ticket machines and / or pay parking place (s)*

**32. (1) Application.**

Application for permission for the non-operation of a parking ticket machine(s) or a Pay and Display Parking Place(s) or any parking place(s) within a Council car park or public road(s) in the functional area of the Council must be made in writing for the following:

- (a) placement of a skip;
- (b) placement of a cherry picker;
- (c) placement of a crane;
- (d) placement of vehicle over 3 tonnes;
- (e) filming purposes and/or associated vehicles;
- (f) utilities works and/or vehicles;
- (g) opening of access to the public road; and
- (h) any other circumstances at the discretion of the Council.

**(2) Conditions of permission.**

The permission, if granted, shall be subject to any conditions which will be specified in writing by the Council, including the payment of a fee by the person requesting the permission.

**(3) Issue of Permissions.**

The permission, if granted, will be issued in writing together with notification to the appropriate enforcement agency (if applicable) of the details of the permission.

**(4) Breach of Conditions.**

It shall be an offence to breach a condition specified in writing in the permission.


